TECHNICAL ANNOUNCEMENT

1. GENERAL

The 2010 U.S. Figure Skating qualifying competition season consists of a total of 14 events. These include 12 qualifying events (nine regional championships, three sectional championships), the 2010 U.S. Junior Figure Skating Championships (juvenile and intermediate) and the 2010 AT&T U.S. Figure Skating Championships (novice, junior and senior). All 14 events are sanctioned by U.S. Figure Skating and conducted according to the most current U.S. Figure Skating rulebook, 2010 edition, with changes and clarifications as posted on the U.S. Figure Skating web site and this announcement. Compliance with these rules as updated or amended is the responsibility of the participants. U.S. Figure Skating reserves the right to incorporate revisions to the international judging system (IJS) made by the ISU for junior and senior events and by U.S. Figure Skating to novice events and below.

The qualifying and national championship competitions are only open to competitors who (1) Are current members of U.S. Figure Skating (2) Meet the eligibility requirements according to U.S. Figure Skating Rule 3035 (3) Meet all age and test requirements pertaining to the event you are entering and (4) Meet the citizen and residency requirements as stated in Rule 3065.

Non-U.S. citizens who have already received a letter of permission from the chair of the Competitions Committee and were accepted to compete in the U.S. Figure Skating qualifying system are eligible to register. All other non-US citizens seeking eligibility must meet the requirements set forth in Rule 3065.

Important Notice for All Coaches

All coaches must comply with the coaches' registration policy in order to be allowed to instruct/coach at all qualifying competitions. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show proof of registration plus membership in both U.S. Figure Skating and PSA in order to receive a credential. Each local organizing committee (LOC) will ask to see each coach's registration, membership cards and a photo ID at check in. If they have not registered, they will not be allowed a credential – no exceptions.

Important Notice for All Pairs and Dance Teams

All pairs and dance teams will begin their qualifying at their respective sectional championships (unless they have been notified of a bye advancing them directly to the U.S. Championships). These events will no longer be offered at the regional championships.

2. REGISTRATION

A. METHOD

Online Electronic Registration (Required)

Online registration is the ONLY method available for entry into the 2010 U.S. Figure Skating qualifying competition season.

To enter online into the 2010 qualifying competition season, proceed in the following manner:

- Log on to www.usfsaonline.org
- Input your username and password
 - Your username is your U.S. Figure Skating membership number.
 - If you do not already have a password, go to www.usfsaonline.org first and follow the online instructions.

B. DEADLINES

The entry deadline for the 2010 qualifying competition season is **11:59 p.m., Sept. 1, 2009**. The time zone of your primary residence/principle training center (juvenile, intermediate) or home club (novice, junior, senior) will determine the entry deadline of 11:59 p.m., Sept. 1, 2009.

**NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE!
NO LATE REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS DEADLINE!**

Juvenile and Intermediate Singles Competitors ONLY:

During the online registration process, you will be given the option to input your principle training center if you wish to compete out of the region you train rather than the region in which your primary residence is listed. The following guidelines must be followed:

- You must train at your principle training center at least six (6) months and one (1) day during the calendar year to be eligible
- The region you select is binding (whether it is based on primary residence or principle training center) and cannot be changed.

Age requirements must be met by **Sept. 1, 2009**.

Test requirements must also be met by **Sept. 1, 2009**. Provisional entries based on passing a test after the closing date of entries will not be accepted. Please refer to U.S. Figure Skating Rules 3107, 3108 and 3109 for further testing information and guidelines.

C. BYES

No medical byes will be considered. Competitors awarded a bye to their sectional championships or the U.S. Championships will receive official notification in writing from U.S. Figure Skating. All competitors wishing to compete in the 2010 qualifying competition season, including those who receive a bye, must enter by the Sept. 1, 2009, deadline.

D. ENTRY FEES

All competitors entering the 2010 qualifying competition season must submit payment of the appropriate entry fee (amounts listed below) to U.S. Figure Skating. All competitors are required to pay both the entry fee into the qualifying competition season (for each event entered) and the administrative fee. All fees are nonrefundable.

Sectional Championships Qualifying Entry Fees

Those singles skaters advancing, regardless of method, from their regional championships to the sectional championships will incur an additional \$150 entry fee plus \$10 administrative fee. This total will automatically be charged to the credit card that paid the initial entry fee.

Your registration is not considered valid until all appropriate entry and administrative fees are paid and all required forms (including the planned program content sheet) are completed online to U.S. Figure Skating.

E. PAYMENT

Online payment via credit card is the **ONLY** accepted form of payment.

For those competitors advancing to their respective sectional championships from their regional championships, the credit card used during the initial entry registration will be automatically charged the additional sectional entry fee. If an alternative card must be used for the payment of the sectional entry fee, contact Lindsay Mulvey, U.S. Figure Skating, at 719.635.5200.

Once entered, all withdrawals are considered final. A skater may not reenter even if the withdrawal occurs prior to the entry deadline on Sept. 1, 2009.

3. TECHNICAL DETAILS

A. CONDUCT OF EVENTS

For the 2010 season, all events and levels at all championship competitions (regional, sectional, U.S. Junior Championships, U.S. Championships) will be conducted in accordance with the international judging system (IJS).

B. AGE and TEST QUALIFICATIONS

All age and test requirements can be found in the U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook starting with Rule 3640 (senior singles) and on the U.S. Figure Skating web site at http://www.usfigureskating.org/New_Judging.asp.

C. TECHNICAL ELEMENTS

The well-balanced program charts for all levels and disciplines are posted on the U.S. Figure Skating web site at http://www.usfigureskating.org/New_Judging.asp. As referenced earlier in this announcement, U.S. Figure Skating will incorporate all changes made by the ISU with regard to well-balanced programs. Please refer to this web site often for continuous updates.

All competitors entering into the 2010 qualifying competition season are required as part of their online registration to submit a planned program content sheet (PPCS) detailing the elements in their program(s). You may update your PPCS at www.usfsaonline.org up to one week prior to the start of your competition.

D. MUSIC

COMPETITION MUSIC INFORMATION (Required component of online registration)

U.S. Figure Skating requires all competitors to fully complete a competition music information form as part of the online registration process.

The following information is required for each piece of music used in the composition of the short program/original dance and free skate/free dance: composer, orchestra, duration of music, record label/number (optional but highly recommended if obtainable).

COMPACT DISCS (CDs)

For all qualifying events during the 2010 season, CDs are the only acceptable media. CDs must be clearly marked with name, event entered and the music length. **Each CD must have only ONE (1) track on it. In the case of a short program and free program, two (2) separate discs must be used.** Any disc with more than one (1) track will NOT be accepted! Lead in time (time before the music begins) on CDs may not exceed two (2) seconds.

New for 2010

Each CD must be in a paper CD sleeve with a see through window (obtainable at any office supply store), also labeled with the skater's name and event. Standard hard plastic jewel cases or other CD holders are no longer acceptable. CDs that are not properly identified will NOT be accepted. **Due to compatibility and reliability reasons, music may NOT be submitted on re-recordable "CD-RW" discs.**

Competition music must be turned in at the registration desk at the time of registration. At the Championships, competitors will not receive their credentials at registration until they turn in their music. The originals used at the Regional Championships will be forwarded to the

Sectional Championships and the U.S. Junior Championships for those advancing. Those qualifying from the Sectional Championships will have their original music forwarded on to the U.S. Junior Championships/U.S. Championships.

Skaters receiving byes to the U.S. Championships must mail their competition music on CD no later than one (1) month (Dec. 13, 2009) prior to the start of the U.S. Championships to the following address:

CD's are to be mailed in "CD Mailers", which can be obtained at the post office or any office supply store.

All competitors must have at least one (1) additional copy rinkside at practice sessions and during the actual competition event. The LOC will accept no responsibility for damage or loss.

U.S. Figure Skating will supply current dance music for compulsory dances.

E. OFFICIAL BULLETIN BOARD

The official bulletin board will contain any announcements or changes, and it is the responsibility of the competitors to check it often for official notices. Please refer to the local portion of the announcement for further information regarding the bulletin board.

4. ADVANCEMENT TO SECTIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS/U.S. JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

A. QUALIFIERS

SINGLES COMPETITORS

All singles competitors advancing to the sectional championships or the U.S. Junior Championships will receive instructions for downloading the specific event announcement from www.usfsaonline.org for the competition to which they have advanced.

For every competitor, all information required to be sent to the sectional championships or U.S. Junior Figure Skating Championships local organizing committees (photos, practice ice requests, etc.) must be postmarked no later than the THURSDAY FOLLOWING YOUR REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS. Any information postmarked after the Thursday following your regional championships will be accepted ONLY at the discretion of the local organizing committee.

For those competitors receiving a bye to the sectional championships, you will receive either instructions for downloading the announcement or your announcement via email and must follow the deadlines set forth by the LOC.

B. ALTERNATES

Skaters placing in fifth and sixth place (unless there are fill-ins) at the regional championships in the novice, junior and senior singles events will be designated as first and second alternates. These competitors will be provided access to an event announcement as they may be selected to compete up to 48 hours before their competition event.

The succeeding two (2) placed skaters not advanced by the percentage system in juvenile and intermediate singles are the first and second alternates respectively and will be provided access to an announcement for the U.S. Junior Championships.

Alternates do not need to mail in any paperwork or required forms unless contacted by U.S. Figure Skating.

5. INSURANCE/LIABILITY

A. LIABILITY

U.S. Figure Skating, the host club(s) and/or interclub association, the organizing committee, and the ice arenas being utilized for these events accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in these championships (U.S. Figure Skating Rule 3222).

5. ANTI-DOPING

Anti-doping tests will be conducted at the 2010 AT&T U.S. Figure Skating Championships, held in Spokane, Wash., Jan. 14-24, 2010. Senior-level competitors only are eligible to be tested. If selected, testing is mandatory.

DEADLINES FOR FORMS

All skaters must submit the forms provided in this LOC portion of the announcement. The credentials form, practice ice form, and program photos must be postmarked no later than **Sept. 1, 2009**. *For all forms, do not use any form of delivery that would require a signature for receipt.*

VENUE

The 2010 Southwest Pacific Regional Championships will be held at the Ice Den, located at 9375 East Bell Road, Scottsdale, AZ 85260. The facility has two indoor ice surfaces, each measuring 200 x 85 ft with slightly rounded corners. Competition will be conducted on one surface. Judges will be seated on the side opposite the audience and skaters will enter the ice from the zamboni end of the audience side. Practice ice sessions will also be available at the Ice Den. The facility is located approximately 24 miles northeast of **Sky Harbor International Airport** in Phoenix. Please refer to the enclosed map for the locations of the venue and local hotels. TRANSPORTATION

Visitors arriving by air should fly into the Sky Harbor International Airport in Phoenix, AZ, approximately 30 minutes south of the rink. Refer to the enclosed map for general directions. Note that the map also gives general locations of local attractions and shopping malls. While in the Phoenix/Scottsdale area, competitors are responsible for their own transportation.

REGISTRATION DESK

A registration desk will be open in the lobby of the Ice Den from Friday, Oct. 23 through Tuesday, Oct. 27, 2009 during all practice and competition hours. Competitors must check in at the registration desk at least one hour prior to their scheduled events to turn in music and receive their credentials and other information.

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

An official schedule of events will be posted on www.2010swp.com as well as at the Ice Den. Schedules will not be mailed to individual participants. Because the schedule is subject to change, participants should check the web site regularly prior to the start of the competition and check the official bulletin board at the arena throughout the competition.

OFFICIAL NOTICES

During the competition, updates will be posted on the official bulletin board in the lobby of the Ice Den. Information on this bulletin board supersedes all other official information and is considered sufficient notice to all participants. It is the responsibility of the skater, parent, and coach to check this board upon arrival and regularly during the competition for changes of schedule or other important information.

SECURITY / CREDENTIALS

Entrance to the competition arena is by credential or ticket only. Credentials and tickets for the Southwest Pacific Regional Championships may also be used for admission to the concurrent SWP Nonqualifying Competition and vice versa.

- **Competitors:** Each regional championships competitor will receive a credential for no additional charge.
- **Coaches:** One coach credential will be provided for each skater for no additional charge. This credential will allow entry to all areas of the venue. Coaches must be current members of U.S. Figure Skating and the PSA and have coach's registration to receive credentials.
- **Chaperone:** One chaperone credential will be provided for each skater for no additional charge.
- **Additional coach or chaperone:** Each competitor may purchase one additional chaperone credential for \$35. Each skater may purchase one additional coach credential for \$35 each.
- **Changes:** Competitors may make one change to chaperone and/or coach designations; these must be made at the registration desk by the non-minor skater or his/her parent or guardian.
- **Replacement:** Lost credentials may be replaced for \$35.

TICKETS

General admission to the competition is \$10 per day. Day passes will be available for purchase at the rink on the same day as admission. All-event (multi-day) tickets may be purchased in advance (using the enclosed form) for \$35 each.

PRACTICE ICE

Official practice sessions will begin on Friday, Oct. 23 at the Ice Den. All official practice sessions will be 30 minutes for \$20. Music will be played at all official practice sessions, but there may not be time to play each skater's music. Music will be played according to a random draw. Some practice sessions may be held on the secondary ice surface at the Ice Den. Official practice ice may be reserved in advance with pre-payment, using the Practice Ice form. The official practice ice schedule and assignments will be posted on www.2010swp.com.

UNOFFICIAL PRACTICE

Unofficial practice ice will be offered as ice time permits. The days and times will be determined as the competition schedule is finalized. Some practice sessions may be held on the secondary ice surface at the Ice Den. Skaters may request unofficial practice ice on the Practice Ice form, or by signing up at the practice ice desk at the rink starting on Friday, Oct. 23. No unofficial practice ice reservations will be accepted without payment. The fee for each 30 minute unofficial practice is \$20 per skater. Music will not be played on unofficial practice.

PROGRAM

All skaters must submit a Program Photo form and a head/shoulders photograph for inclusion in the program. Print or electronic photos (on CD or via email) may be submitted. Electronic photos may be emailed to Kevin Little at kck06@cox.net .

AWARDS

Medals will be awarded for first through fourth place, and trophies will be awarded to the first place winners. Results are not official until posted. Medalists should appear in costume at the designated awards area for podium photos and to receive important information for the U.S. Junior Figure Skating Championships or the Pacific Coast Sectional Championships.

VIDEO/PHOTOGRAPHY

All U.S. Figure Skating Championship Competitions (including regional championships) will be professionally videotaped and photographed. Video will be provided by and available for purchase from the official event videographer assigned by U.S. Figure Skating. Personal videotaping of the competition in any form is not permitted.

Podium and action photography services may also be purchased by competitors for additional fees paid directly to the vendors. Personal photography is permitted for personal use only and resale of purchased photos is strictly prohibited. No flash photography is allowed.

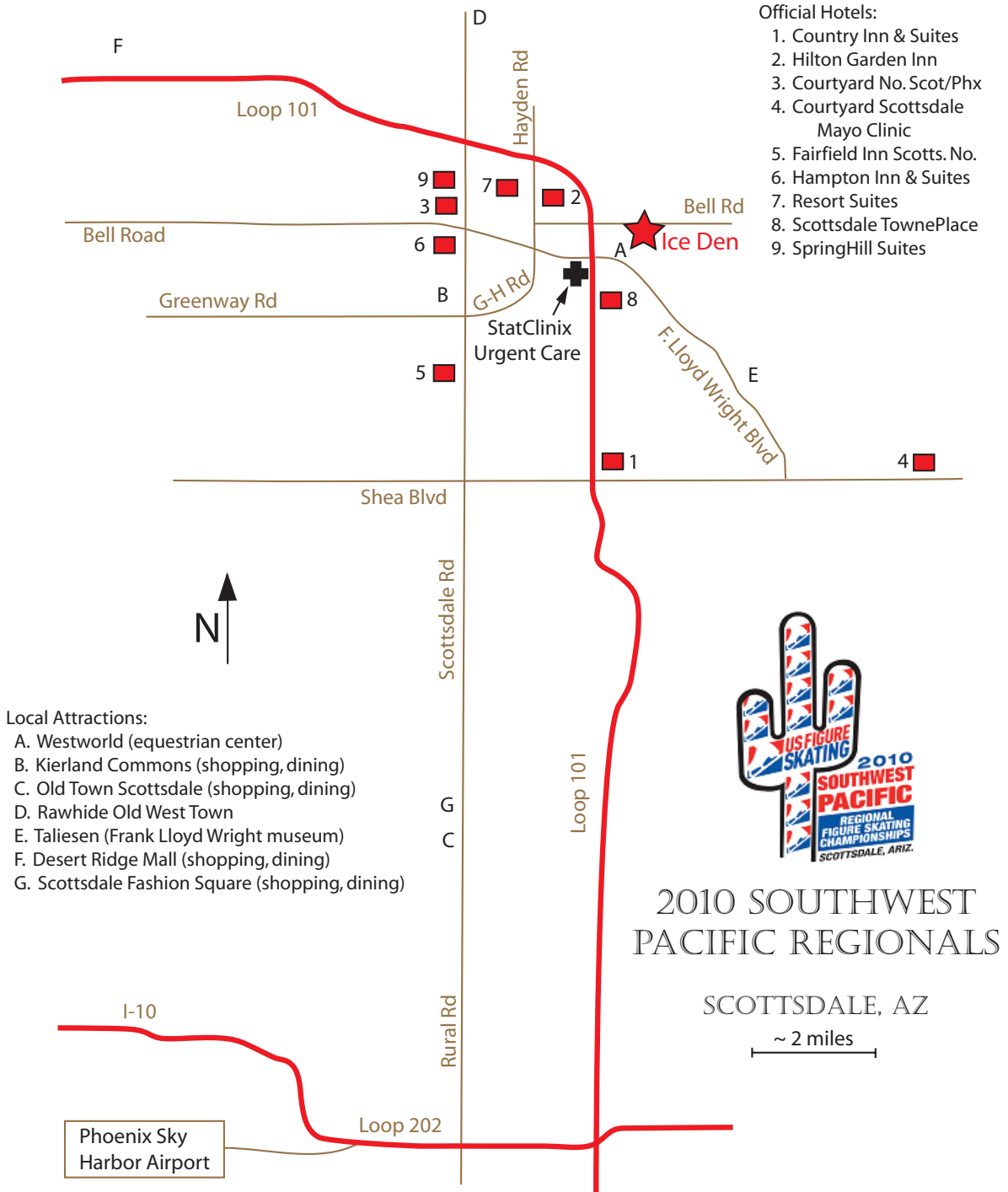
