2006 CACTUS CLASSIC JULY 20-23, 2006

The 2006 Cactus Classic Competition is a non-qualifying competition sanctioned by United States Figure Skating and will be conducted according to the rules set forth in the 2006 US Figure Skating Rulebook.

Events will be offered in **Basic Skills (see separate announcement), Free Skating, Compulsory Moves, Pairs, Dance, Artistic** (light, dramatic, and duet), **Special Skaters, Team, Synchronized, and Theatre on Ice.**

ELIGIBILITY

Skaters must be a current member of US Figure Skating. All participants of Synchronized and Theatre on Ice Teams are required to be current members of US Figure Skating.

Event Levels - participants must enter event(s) based on the test level(s) and appropriate age in accordance with the current US Figure Skating rulebook, unless otherwise noted. All test and age requirements are as of the close of entries (June 17, 2006). Skaters may choose to skate one level higher if so desired. Individual events must all be skated at the same level (Compulsory, Free Skating, Artistic).

Previous first place winners in a No-Test through Pre-Juvenile level at the 2005 Cactus Classic must skate at a higher level than was skated in 2005.

FACILITIES

The Alltel Ice Den is a dual surface indoor rink with each surface measuring 200' x 85' with slightly rounded corners. For additional information regarding facility and directions please visit www.Coyotesice.com or call 480-585-5811.

ENTRIES

The entry fee must accompany the completed entry form and be received no later than **Saturday, June 17, 2006**. If the number of applicants exceed the ice time available, entries will be determined on a "first come first served" basis. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Referee and the Local Organizing Committee, and will be subject to a \$25 late fee. **NO REFUNDS WILL BE ISSUED AFTER THE CLOSE OF ENTRIES, JUNE 17, 2006 UNLESS NO COMPETITION EXISTS FOR THAT EVENT.**

Synchronized and Theater on Ice Teams are to be entered on a separate entry form by their coach. Team members who are not entered in any other event do not need to complete a separate entry form.

A \$35 fee will be charged if any check is returned due to insufficient funds. The skater will not be allowed to skate until the appropriate fees have been paid including the \$35 returned check fee (CASH OR MONEY ORDER ONLY). NO EXCEPTIONS.

COMPETITION

Entries will be grouped by age for all divisions except Juvenile and above, which will be seeded in accordance with US Figure Skating qualifying competition rules as outlined in the current US Figure Skating Rulebook.

Two entries will constitute an event. In order to constitute an event, the organizing committee reserves the right to combine a single entry with an event group. This will be done with the consent of the single entry skater involved. Event levels will be combined for Team Compulsories, Artistic and Shadow Dance events. If no competition exists in an event, an exhibition may be allowed at the discretion of the Chief Referee. An exhibition critique may be offered if time permits.

The Chief Referee is responsible for the 2006 Cactus Classic Competition and their judgment on issues of proper conduct of the competition, including safety and the reputation of the sport, shall be final.

JUDGING

The closed system of judging will be used for all events. All events will use the 6.0 system of judging with the exception of Juvenile and higher Short Program and Free Skating events, Juvenile and higher Pair events, and Juvenile and higher couple's Dance events. These events will be judged using the ISU Judging System (IJS) of judging. Artistic events may include judges from the arts and entertainment community.

REGISTRATION

The registration desk will be located in the lobby of the Alltel Ice Den. It will open one hour before the first event of the day and remain open until the last event of the day. Competitors must register upon arrival and check in at least one hour prior to their event(s).

MUSIC

Music must be one track and provided on CD or mini disk (No CD-RW) or cassette tape with the skater's name, event, level and side to be played clearly marked. Skaters are required to have a back-up copy of their music. Cassettes must be rewound. Music must be turned in at the registration desk *at least* 45 minutes prior to the event to be skated. Music may be picked-up at the registration desk following the event. The organizing committee will provide music for Compulsory Dance events.

NOTE: Do not leave cassettes or CDs in the sun as damage may occur.

PRACTICE ICE

Practice ice will be scheduled on Wednesday, July 19th. Pre-purchased thirty minute sessions are \$15.00.

Each competitor may purchase one unit of practice ice per event entered. Short and long programs are considered two events. Synchronized and Theatre on Ice teams may purchase one thirty-minute session for \$170. Sessions will be posted on the Cactus Classic web site www.coyotesscofaz.com and the official bulletin board located at the Alltel Ice Den. The playing of music during practice ice will be determined by draw and begin after a four (4) minute warm-up. Every attempt will be made to play a skater's music however there is **no guarantee**.

NOTE: There may also be a limited amount of practice during the competition. Please see the registration desk for details.

RESULTS AND AWARDS

Results will be posted in the lobby of the Alltel Ice Den as soon as they become available. Copies may be purchased at the registration desk. Skaters, wearing their costume and skates, are required to report to the awards area once results are posted. Awards will be given to 1st through 4th place in all events. Synchronized and Theatre on Ice teams will receive a team trophy with each team member receiving a medal.

SPECIAL AWARDS

Sylvia Friedman Memorial Trophy: Most outstanding Free Skating performance exhibiting artistic and technical merit at the Intermediate through Senior level.

Michael Pavich Memorial Trophy: Most artistic Free Skating performance by a Coyotes SC of AZ member at the Preliminary through Juvenile level.

Coyotes SC of AZ Junior Board Award: Most artistic Free Skating interpretation at the Pre-Preliminary level. Judged by the Coyotes SC of AZ Junior Board.

The name of each recipient of the above awards will be engraved on a permanent award and displayed by the Coyotes SC of AZ at the Alltel Ice Den. Each recipient will receive an award presented by the sponsor.

ADMISSION AND EVENT PROGRAMS

There is no admission charge for Cactus Classic. A limited number of programs will be available on the day of competition. To pre-purchase at a discount see the entry form. Advertising space in the program may be obtained for a donation to the Coyotes SC of AZ; see "Event Program Advertising Form" for details.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO

Spectators are reminded that flash photography is dangerous and will be strictly prohibited. A professional photographer will be available in the awards area. Skaters who have placed in their event are required to have a group photo taken, purchase of photo is optional. Individual photos will be taken upon request regardless of placement.

Personal video cameras are permitted but may only be used to film your own participant's performance, for personal use. *It is strictly prohibited to film any other skater's performance.* Only battery powered video units are allowed; electrical cords, tripods (or similar devices) are not permitted in the arena. Professional videography will be available for purchase. Arrangements must be made with the vendor prior to the participant's event. Videotapes may be purchased from the vendor or footage may be added to an existing tape provided by the participant.

Compulsory Events

US Figure Skating No Test through Juvenile & Adult – Elements are to be skated in program form, in any order, without music. Connecting moves are required at all levels. Duration times are the maximum allowed.

No Test - Must not have passed any US Figure Skating test. Competed on ½ sheet of ice. Duration: 1:15 maximum.

1. Waltz jump
2. Salchow
3. Flip or lutz jump
4. Upright scratch spin, minimum 3 revolutions
5. Forward Spiral

Pre-Pre No Axel – Competed on ½ sheet of ice. Duration: 1:15 maximum.

1. Flip jump
2. Combination jump consisting of any two single jumps, no axel
3. Split jump
4. FO spiral
5. Forward sit spin, minimum 3 revolutions

Pre-Pre Axel –Competed on ½ sheet of ice. Duration: 1:15 maximum.

1. Flip jump
2. Combination jump consisting of any two single jumps, axel permitted
3. Split jump
4. FO spiral
5. Forward sit spin, minimum 3 revolutions

Preliminary – Competed on ½ sheet of ice. Duration: 1:15 maximum.

1. Single jump of choice
2. Combination jump consisting of any two single jumps, may not repeat single jump selected above
3. Camel spin, minimum 3 revolutions
4. Combination spin, no change of foot
5. Footwork sequence, straight line or diagonal

Pre-Juvenile – Competed on ½ sheet of ice. Duration: 1:15 maximum.

1. Double jump of choice
2. Combination jump consisting of any two single jump or double-single
3. Combination spin with no change of foot and one change of position, minimum 6 revolutions
4. Ina Bauer or spread eagle

Juvenile- Competed on full sheet of ice. Duration: 1:15 maximum.

1. Axel
2. Straight line step sequence
3. Combination spin with one change of foot and one change of position
4. Combination jump consisting of a double-single or double-double

Open-Juvenile- Competed on full sheet of ice. Duration: 1:15 maximum.

1. Axel
2. Straight line step sequence
3. Combination spin with one change of foot and one change of position
4. Combination jump consisting of a double-single or double-double

Adult Pre-Bronze - Competed on ½ sheet of ice. Duration: 1:15 maximum.

1. Waltz Jump
2. One foot spin, entry optional
3. Forward inside edges, 4-6 consecutive
4. Backward Crossovers to a back outside edge, (landing position) clockwise or counter-clockwise
5. Toe Loop jump

Adult Bronze - Competed on ½ sheet of ice. Duration: 1:15 maximum.

1. Waltz jump/Toe Loop
2. Salchow jump
3. Back spin
4. Scratch Spin
5. Back outside edges, 4-6 consecutive

Adult Silver - Competed on ½ sheet of ice. Duration: 1:30 maximum.

1. Single jump of choice
2. Combination jump consisting of any two single jumps or double-single
3. Combination spin with no change of foot and one change of position
4. Ina Bauer or spread eagle

Adult Gold - Competed on ½ sheet of ice. Duration: 1:30 maximum.

1. Axel
2. Straight line step sequence
3. Combination spin with one change of foot and one change of position
4. Combination jump consisting of double-single or double-double

Team Compulsory Event

Teams must consist of 4 skaters at similar level. There are 4 elements for each team; elements are to assigned one per team member. Elements will be performed one at a time and scored independently. Each element is worth 25% of the team's overall score. A limited number of connecting steps may be used, however, only the specific element will be judged. The highest level on any individual team member will determine the team's event level. Team members may be of different club affiliations.

No-Test - Pre-Preliminary

1. Flip jump
2. Camel/sit spin combination
3. Spiral sequence
4. Lutz/loop combination

Preliminary - Pre-Juvenile

1. Double Salchow
2. Lay back spin
3. Spiral sequence
4. Axel/toe loop combination

Juvenile - Intermediate

1. Double Lutz
2. Camel sit change sit combo
3. Spiral sequence
4. Double flip/double loop combination

Novice - Senior

1. Double Axel
2. Spiral sequence using entire ice surface
3. Double lutz/double loop combination
4. Combination spin with one change of foot & at least one change of position

Special Skaters

Special Skater Level 1 – Open to skaters of any age. Level based on highest Special Olympics test passed. Vocals are permitted. Duration 1:00. Elements from US Figure Skating Special Olympics level 1.

Special Skater Level 2 – Open to skaters of any age. Level based on highest Special Olympics test passed. Duration 1:30. Elements from US Figure Skating Special Olympics level 2 or below.

Special Skater Level 3 through 4 – Open to skaters of any age. Level based on highest Special Olympics test passed. Duration 2:00. Elements from US Figure Skating Special Olympics level entered or below.

Synchronized Team

Preliminary Synchronized Team – Eligibility Rule 4710. Program duration 2:00 (+/- 10 seconds). Program Content Rule 4711.

Open Juvenile Synchronized Team – Eligibility Rule 4770. Program duration 2:30 (+/- 10 seconds). Program Content Rule 4711.

Open Adult Synchronized Team – Eligibility Rule 4780. Program duration 2:30 (+/- 10 seconds). Program Content Rule 4781.

ARTISTIC EVENTS

Artistic events include light, dramatic and interpretive for singles. Events are also offered for duets and Theatre on Ice teams. Same rules of eligibility apply for artistic events that apply to free skating events. Juvenile and Open Juvenile levels may be combined.

Programs are intended to enhance the skater's artistry and interpretation of the music rather than focusing on technical difficulty. Skating attire must fit the program and be appropriate for a family event. Hand held props (no glass) are allowed and can be set down on the ice. Except for Theatre on Ice, no props may remain on the ice for the entire program.

All programs will be skated on full ice. Vocal music is permitted.

Light & Dramatic – Light programs are to be of a “feel good” nature where as Dramatic are to be more serious or melancholy in nature. Moves are to be selected for their value in enhancing the skater's artistry and interpretation of the music rather than technical difficulty. There are no requirements for jumps and spins, except that the difficulty may not exceed the equivalent free skating level. Cartwheels are permitted. Credit for jumps or spins will be based solely on the choreographic effectiveness.

Interpretive – Skaters are to create a program without assistance. Coaches and parents will not be allowed in the skaters' area once a skater has checked in. The organizing committee will supply a different piece of music for each interpretive event. Music will be approximately 1 minute to 1:30 in length.

During the warm-up the skaters will hear the selected music two times. Following the warm up, the skaters with the exception of the first to skate, will be escorted to an area where they will not be able to view or hear the performance of the skaters preceding them. The music will be played a third time for the first skater before they take the ice. As the first skater is announced the next skater will be brought to a place where they can hear the music for a third time but will not be able to view the performance of the skater preceding them. This procedure will continue for all skaters in the group.

Programs will be judged on artistic impression, choreography and pattern, creativity, musical interpretation, posture and carriage.

Duets – Create a program with another skater of similar skill level and perform the routine like you are in an ice show. Partner combination may be of any gender and may be of different club affiliation. Complete the entry form based on your individual skating level. Your duet event level will be determined based on the highest level partner of the duet. Partner lifts are not permitted.

Theatre on Ice Teams

Teams of 8 – 30 skaters are to create a routine that includes a theme, emotion or story that is enhanced by music, costuming, props and choreography.

Rules are outlined in the USFS Theatre on Ice 2006 Guidelines. No on-ice curtain will be used for this event.

Senior – 100% of the team must have passed the pre-preliminary MIF test (or pre-bronze adult MIF test) and 50% or more of the team members must have passed the intermediate MIF test. No age restrictions.

Junior – 100% of the team must have passed the pre-preliminary MIF test (or pre-bronze adult MIF test) and 50% or more of the team must have passed the juvenile MIF. No age restrictions.

Novice – 100% of the team must have passed the pre-preliminary MIF test (or pre-bronze adult MIF test). No age restrictions.

Juvenile: 100% of the team must have passed the Pre- Preliminary MIF test. No more than 50% may have passed Preliminary MIF, or higher. All skaters must be 13 years of age or younger as of the preceding July 1st of the membership year.

Adult - At least 75% of the team has reached the age of 21 years as of the July 1st preceding the competition. In addition, 100% of the team must have passed at least one U.S. Figure Skating test (other than a basic skills badge). This may include an adult or standard MIF, individual dance test (passing the entire dance category not required), freestyle, or pairs.

Times are 6 minutes plus or minus 30 seconds for Senior, Junior, and Adult
 5 minutes plus or minus 30 seconds for Novice
 4 minutes plus or minus 30 seconds for Juvenile

Solo and Shadow Dance Events

Solo Dance-There are no age restrictions. More than one level of dance may be skated as long as test requirements are met.

Shadow Dance -Just for fun, two individuals skate as a “shadow”. Partner combination may be of any age, gender, and club affiliation. No contact is to be made with partner. The following levels will be combined for the Shadow Dance event: Beginner through Preliminary, Pre-Bronze through Bronze and Pre-Silver and above.
